

Residence Hall Check List of Things to Bring:

Here is a list of suggested things to bring if you are living in the Residence Hall. Having items that transform your room into a home will make you feel more settled and comfortable!

What You *Should* Bring:

3M Command Adhesive products for posters and pictures

Alarm clock

Backpack or book bag

Basic cleaning supplies (surface cleaner, cleaning/dusting rags, etc.)

Bathrobe, shower shoes and a container for shower items

Bedspreads, comforter, blankets, etc.

Bicycle and lock

Calculator

Camera

Checkbook/Debit card

Computer

Copy of personal health and property insurance cards

Copy of property serial numbers (computer, digital camera, bicycle, etc.)

Dictionary/Thesaurus

DVD/VCR

twin sheets (most beds are standard; some are extra long; if you plan on purchasing new sheets, we recommend waiting until you arrive)

First aid kit

Flashlight with batteries

Hair dryer, curling iron, shaver, etc.

Kitchen items (dishes, preferably plastic or other break-resistant items, can opener, ice cube trays)

Laundry basket and detergent

Medicine (Over the counter drugs – Advil, Tylenol, etc.)

Message board and dry-erase markers (for door)

Pillows

Planner and/or calendar

Plastic organizer containers (food containers, miscellaneous storage, etc.)

Soap, shampoo, deodorant, and other personal hygiene products

Surge strips or surge protectors

Telephone (one per room; automated voicemail is provided)

Mini Fridge (Size: 4.5 cubic feet or less, 1.5 amps or less) – 1 per resident

Towels, wash cloths

TV (with coaxial cable for connection to cable service [recommend no less than 15' cable]; one connection per room)

Trash can(s)

Umbrella, other rain gear

Crate for transporting food, pans, and cleaning supplies to the kitchen

Skillet and Spatula

What You Should *Not* Bring:

Anything listed in the [academic catalogue](#) as inappropriate (i.e., alcohol, tobacco products, etc.)

Candles

Fireworks

Halogen torchiere lamps (i.e., halogen pole lamps)

Incense

Lamps with plastic shades

Ozone machines

Pets

Small Appliances: Microwave, deep fryer, toasters/toaster ovens, hot plate (or anything with an open heating coil), etc.

Small Appliance Exceptions: Cooking is not permitted in the student's room. An electric skillet (griddle style), George Foreman Grill/sandwich maker, crock pot, and/or rice cooker may be used in the kitchen area only, but must be kept in a box when stored in the student's room.

Space Heaters

Waterbeds

Weapons (or any item that may be construed as a weapon)

Optional (available for check-out)

Vacuum

Broom and Dust pan
